


Pacing Guide and Supporting Activities: Practicing Mindfulness During Back-to-School Transition

Grade Band: **Grade 6-8** | Duration: **5 Days**

Overview: Students watch BrainPOP's Mindfulness movie and engage in accompanying activities to learn techniques they can practice when feeling overwhelmed. Then they explore the Back-to-School 2021 topic, and consider how they can apply mindfulness strategies as they make the transition back to in-person learning.

Unit Goal: Students produce a movie, using BrainPOP's Make-a-Movie tool, to describe how mindfulness can help ease back into the school year.


